JESUS AND THE LITTLE CHILDREN

"Then children were brought to him that he might lay hands on them and pray" Matthew 19:13.

How were the children brought to Him? By their parents, of course. That says something to us today. The only way that little children can come to Jesus is that they be carried. Luke's account of this event in chapter 18:15-17 even uses the Greek word for "infants." After the disciples rebuked the people for bothering Jesus, the Master replied, *"Let the children come to Me, and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of God Whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it"* (Luke 18:16).

Parents carry their children to the Baptismal font. There the infant simply receives God's promise of salvation in Jesus Christ and the faith to trust that promise. What a glorious transaction! This sinful-by-nature creation is made a child of God and brought into His kingdom. No fireworks, no bells and whistles, no lightning from heaven. Just ordinary water made extraordinary by the Word of God.

Parents carry their children to the Divine Service. There these infants are further nourished by receiving the gifts of God through the Word. It often does not appear to be so as the children learn not to wiggle and squirm or talk out loud, but God's Word *"shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it"* (Isaiah 55:11). No fireworks, no bells and whistles, no lightning from heaven. God is forming the little ones into the likeness of Christ quietly through His promise.

Parents carry their children to Sunday school where they are taught the Word of God and are further nourished by it. There they learn how much Jesus loves them and cares for them through the love shown to them by their teachers who faithfully prepare and teach the Bible stories (which are actually only one story – the story of Jesus from Genesis to Revelation). No fireworks, no bells and whistles, no lightning from heaven. Just faith that was given in Baptism being nurtured.

Parents carry their children to the home altar for family devotions, for God has given the parents the primary responsibility for passing on the faith to the next generation. No fireworks, no bells and whistles, no lightning from heaven. Just hard work on the parents' part to carve out family worship time and stick to it.

In like manner, we adults, too, are carried into the kingdom of God by Jesus Himself, the Word. Just like infants who cannot even feed themselves, we are not capable of doing anything toward our salvation. As mothers feed their infants and the infants only receive, our Father in heaven feeds us and we only receive the gifts that God gives – forgiveness, life, and salvation. We adults try to "do good" in order to please God, we attempt to decide our own path to God, we rely on our own abilities and philosophies and are pretty proud of ourselves. But Jesus says we must be like little children, passively receiving nourishment from the merciful God through His Word and Sacraments, simply trusting in Him.

We often just think of stewardship each year when we think of our annual pledge. Ephesians 5:1-2 *"Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children. And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us."* Our sanctification flows from the justification which we have received in Christ. His love for us transforms us into His image. This is why the Bible talks so much about giving – because we are to imitate God in His generosity.

Genesis 22:2 He said, *"Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you."* It's hard for us to even fathom a faith as strong as Abraham's: he follows the Lord's Word even when it seems impossibly hard. But he does so because he knows that the Lord only means to bless. What happened here to Abraham should be an encouragement for us: trust the Lord and keep His Word.

TOPEKA LUTHERAN SCHOOL NEWS

Topeka Lutheran School has been in operation since 1874 when the Rev. P.G. Germann, pastor of the newly established St. John’s Lutheran Church, organized a private school in the church basement at 2nd and Van Buren in Topeka. The school soon became a church project, and in 1885, the congregation built a two-room school house. St. John’s Lutheran School continued to grow, and in 1888 they added a third room to the facility. In 1919, the church bought three lots at 4th and Harrison in Topeka, and opened a new school at this location in 1922. By 1948, this facility had grown to a five-room operation and was quickly outgrowing the site. In 1949, the church purchased the plot of ground at 7th and Roosevelt where the current school is located.
