### **GOD IS GONE UP WITH A SHOUT!**

According to the law of gravity, what goes up must come down. According to the law of theology, what comes down must go up. Or, more to the point, He who comes down must go up!

This is what we confess in the Creed. “I believe...in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God...who for us men and for our salvation *came down from heaven...and ascended into heaven.*”

Now, we all know why He “came down”—it was by Cross and Passion to win salvation. But why did He “go up”?

The ascension is hardly just a seal or sign that the Father had accepted His work of salvation, as if the Father lets Jesus back into heaven because He’d done a jolly good job of it all. Rather, by His ascension the crucified and risen Lord Jesus actually *continues and extends His work of salvation*. We call what He did in His “coming down” *salvation won*. We call what He does in His “going up” *salvation distributed*.

And this is of critical importance. You can’t have one without the other. Without *salvation won* there’s no *salvation distributed*, and without *salvation distributed* precious little good does it do for anyone that *salvation* has been *won*.

Why? Because salvation is grasped *by faith alone*, and faith comes only by hearing—and hearing by the Word of Christ (Romans 10:17). This is the same “Word of Christ” proclaimed to you on Sunday morning and that the Lord Himself has combined with water, bread, and wine. So if someone were to ask you what the ascension means, a very simple and excellent response would be, “It means that Jesus wants to bring the salvation He *won* even to *me*.” Or it means that you should read the “who for us men and for our salvation” not just with “came down from heaven,” but now especially with “and ascended into heaven.”

Indeed, this is exactly what the Bible teaches. In His ascension, from where He sits at the right hand of the Father, the Lord Jesus sends “gifts to men” (Ephesians 4:8). And those gifts Paul lists off include “one body and one Spirit...one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all” (Ephesians 4:4-5) Those are the gifts of the ascended Christ through which He *distributes* the salvation that He *won*.

“one body”	the mystical Body of Christ, the Holy Christian Church
“one Spirit”	the Holy Spirit, who works through Word and Sacrament and by whom alone it is possible to call Jesus “Lord”
“one Lord”	<b>Christ Himself, the <i>winner</i> and now <i>distributor</i> of salvation</b>
“one faith”	faith worked in the heart of every believer in Christ, a pure gift from God
“one Baptism”	the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit through which the Lord offers and gives salvation
“one God and Father of all”	God given to us as our “dear Father in heaven” through our reconciliation to Him through the blood of Christ “so that with all boldness and confidence we may ask Him as dear children ask their dear Father”

This year we're once again celebrating the Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord on the day it falls, 40 days after Easter, Thursday the 10<sup>th</sup> of May at 7:00 p.m. At this Divine Service we'll also be re-consecrating the font from the 1888 St. John's building at which so many of the faithful who have gone before us received “the one Baptism.” Join us.

For He who came down has gone back up; and what He won He now freely distributes...*to you.*

**ASCENSION DAY SERVICE & RE-CONSECRATION

Thursday, May 10, 7 p.m.**

The Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord is one of the five major festivals of the church year: Christmas, Easter, Ascension, Pentecost, and the Holy Trinity. Christ’s Ascension took place 40 days after His Resurrection. Do the math, and you quickly realize that Ascension Day *always falls on a Thursday*.

This year—as we began last year—and every year hereafter we’re going to celebrate the Ascension of Our Lord on the day it falls, Thursday, May 10, at a 7:00 p.m. Divine Service. While that is good, right, and proper, there are also many other reasons for this, not least of which is that more of the ministry of Word and Sacrament means more strengthening of the flock here at St. John’s. Come and receive.

This year’s Divine Service on the Feast of the Ascension will be made all the more special by the blessing of the “old” St. John’s baptismal font. Mark your calendars now. We look forward to seeing you there.

**Rhythm of Faith Choir (3 January – 9 May, 5:30-5:55 p.m.; Bethany Johnson & Marcia Lange)**

### SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS FOR MAY, 2018
