PREPARE YOUR HEART

O Lord, how shall I meet you, how welcome you aright (LSB 334:1)? This should be the perpetual question of the Christian: how will I receive Jesus? Yet, this is also the special question asked during the season of Advent. It is a special question because we spend this time meditating on how Christ has come and how he will come again on judgment day. Advent prepares for the festival of Christmas, the glorious celebration of our Savior's birth. However, we do not spend Advent pretending like we are those Christians who are still waiting for the Messiah to come; we do not forget that Jesus has already become man. Instead, we remind ourselves concerning the person and work of Jesus Christ as we await his return on the day of the Lord. We answer the questions: who is Jesus, what has he come to do? These questions are answered in a unique way each Sunday in Advent, to prepare us rightly to welcome our Lord and Savior.

"O Lord, how shall I meet you?" Advent 1 (*Ad Te Levavi*) answers this, "as the Almighty King." In our Gospel reading, we hear of Jesus' triumphant entrance into the city of Jerusalem, days away from his crucifixion. We hear of the "Hosanna!", of the "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!", of the songs of joy to "the son of David." Although Jesus did not deliver the victory some of these expected (he was to die a shameful death), we know this death did conquer all the enemies of God (sin, death, and the devil). Remembering this great triumph, we lift up our prayers to the Lord to come quickly in the same magnificent manner. The pastor prays on behalf of the congregation, "Stir up Your power, O Lord, and come!" Just as Jesus came then, we hope and await for him to come now, riding this time on the clouds of his angels to enact the new heavens and the new earth.

"O Lord, how shall I meet you?" Advent 2 (*Populus Zion*) answers this, "as the glorious Judge." Jesus gives us vivid descriptions of how he will return at the end of days. Although we have been hearing of this during the last three Sundays of the church year (Nov. 6th, Nov. 13th, Nov 20th), this Sunday is marked by special attention to Jesus' return as our awaited hope. In the Gospel reading we hear, "Now when these things begin to take place, straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near" (Luke 21:28). Yes, the day of the Lord will be a day of great judgment and destruction, but it is also for us a day of joy and rejoicing. With Jesus' arrival is the coming of our salvation, the final defeat over death. We look out for that day by waiting patiently, purifying our hearts and minds through faith in Jesus' promises.

"O Lord, how shall I meet you?" Advent 3 (*Gaudate*) answers this, "as the promised Messiah." We encounter this week John the Baptist as he questions our Lord about his true identity. Jesus testifies clearly that the people of Israel should wait for no other Messiah; he himself is the fulfillment of all God's promises. Jesus proves this by the works he has accomplished: the blind are healed, the lame are walking, the deaf are hearing. The gracious rule and reign of God is shown wherever Jesus appears, wherever he

teaches and heals. On this Sunday we are prepared to welcome him as both the fulfillment of God's promises and the one from whom we can expect mercy.

"O Lord, how shall I meet you?" Advent 4 (*Rorate Coeli*) answers this, "as the imminent Lord." As we inch closer to the great celebration of when God became man, that joyous Christmas day, we finish out our preparation by meditating on Jesus as the Lord who stands in our midst and furnishes us with his gifts. John the Baptist proclaims to us that there is someone greater than he, whose sandals he is not worthy to untie. John has been called to reveal this man. John testified that he was not this man, even though his powerful preaching led some to believe so. John was not this man, but he came to prepare the way for this man. After we have heard the call to repentance as John proclaimed, after we have been shown our need for a Savior, we are ready to receive the peace proclaimed by the God who is with us. We do not have to doubt if this Lord Jesus is in our midst. As we await his final return, we celebrate every time he proclaims his Word through the mouth of the pastor or he feeds us by his body and blood distributed from his altar.

This Advent season, and every Advent, prepare your hearts for the return of our Lord Jesus by taking this journey of preparation. Just as the Lord has come in great pomp and glory, he comes to you now through the ministry of his servants. Jesus has not left us abandoned until his return. He desires all men to believe in him and to welcome him gladly when he comes riding on the clouds with his angels, ready to punish the evil and reward the good. Through his all-sufficient sacrifice on the cross we glory to be counted among those whom he has made good and has prepared for life everlasting. – Vicar John Kastner

CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS PROGRAM A SHEPHERD'S CHRISTMAS

Summary published by Concordia Publishing House:

“The *Quempas* goes 'round” is the expression that has been used for several hundred years to describe *Quempas* singing, a delightful custom that dates back to the Middle Ages. The name *Quempas* comes from the first two words of the carol in the original Latin language: “Quem Pastores.”

Though it can be performed in a variety of arrangements, much symbolism is involved in the celebration of *Quempas*. The light of the candles reminds us of the Light of the world, Christ our Savior. Carrying the light to the four corners of the church can remind us of our privilege and responsibility to carry God's redeeming message to the “four corners of the earth.” Hearing the message being sung from all four corners reminds us that God's love—and Good News—is all around us. The passing of the “song” from congregation to choirs can remind us of the support we give one another in the body of Christ as we go about the task of being His messengers. The emphatic refrain, sung by all, reminds us of the oneness we have in Christ. Tonight's celebration of the *Quempas Carol* is interspersed with the reading of the Christmas story from the Gospel of Luke and the singing of familiar Christmas carols.

In many churches, the *Quempas* constituted the principal item of carol singing on Christmas Eve; in fact, the service was not considered complete without the singing of the *Quempas Carol*—“God's own Son is born a child; God the Father is reconciled!”—is drawn from another very old carol: “Resonet in Laudibus.” The antiphon for tonight's psalm is based on the melody of “Resonet in Laudibus,” indicating that the Psalms point us to Christ and His incarnation.

The Evening Canticle used in this service, known as the *Phos Hilaron*, is one of the oldest Christian hymns, dating from around AD 200. Only one other extra-biblical hymn is older (“Shepherd of Tender Youth”). The *Phos Hilaron* (Greek for “Joyous Light”) has been used during the lighting of lamps at the evening service for centuries.

We hope you will join us for this service and hear the wonderful music the children will provide!

THE MISSION OF THE CHURCH

“Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.” (Matthew 28:19–20a)
 So that we may obtain faith in Christ, God instituted the ministry of teaching the gospel and administering the sacraments. Through the gospel and sacraments, as through means, God gives the Holy Spirit who produces faith, where and when He wills, in those who hear the gospel. (*Augsburg Confession*, Article 5)
