

Astronomy and Music

If you take a moment some time and ask the school children what their favorite constellation is, they would be eager to tell you! During the October and November months, the K-2nd graders learned about 23 constellations, listened to a story from Greek mythology associated with each constellation, and completed an activity that related to it. The 4/5 graders have also been learning astronomy in their science class with Mrs. Kosmicki.

For one of their lessons, they learned about the constellation Lyra. This constellation represents the lyre of Orpheus. His music was so powerful that it even calmed inanimate objects. Like the stars in the sky, music is ordered in such a way to paint a picture, tell a story, or express a character.

Astronomy and music go together because of the "number" that is embedded in creation.

Astronomy is the study of number in space and time, while music is the study of number in time (in addition, geometry is the study of number in space). These subjects make up the "quadrivium" that is prevalent in classical education: arithmetic, geometry, astronomy, and music.

In classical education the connection between various subjects and studies allows for a wholesome formation of a child's exposure to the ordered creation of God's world and fosters the love and appreciation for all of the stories and sounds that are connected to it.

Doorstep Newsletter Article – January 2025

Happy New Year! First and foremost, thank you to everyone who assisted Doorstep in some way to provide Christmas for 260 households with 822 individuals this past December! We tried to provide each person with an item from their wish list, along with books, board games, health kits, blankets, food for several meals, school supplies, if appropriate, and gift cards.

The year 2024 felt a bit like a repeat of 2023 in many ways! The needs of our neighbors remained at an increased level. We provided over 2,700 food orders in 2024, exceeding the higher number we provided in 2023. Doorstep assisted with over 150,000 pounds of food to feed our neighbors and spent over \$75,000 on food purchases to keep the shelves stocked at Doorstep! Our food budget in two years went from \$6,900 to \$75,000; that is an increase of 1,100%! Doorstep applied for more grants to assist with food purchases and our supporting congregations and individuals stepped up to donate more food, and monetarily so we could buy food in bulk. At this point, we do not expect a big decrease in the need in 2025 and our budget reflects the amount we anticipate having to spend to feed our neighbors in need.

One way to help in the first part of 2025 is by donating towards our annual SouperBowl Sunday's collection of soup and crackers! During the weekend of the Super Bowl (February 7th – 9th) we ask our member congregations to collect soup, all varieties, and crackers to help stock our food shelves. A successful event will keep our soup shelves stocked for a few months, at least!

In 2024, we had a goal of 5,000 pounds, and we received over 8,400 pounds!!!!

I cannot stress enough just how thankful and blessed we feel to have the partnership and support of our Mission Members (formerly congregations) as we all work to help our neighbors in need. Of course, our volunteers are an incredibly valuable resource, and Doorstep could not be open without their constant assistance! And, the support of our whole community when Doorstep, and those we help, continues to be inspiring to the work we do!

THE MISSION OF THE CHURCH

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you."
