



The Faith of Our Fathers Conference: The Gospel Shows the Father's Grace

The proper understanding of the Law of God is essential for a Christian. Unfortunately, there has been much disagreement in American Lutheranism concerning the role of the Law in the Church. Last year, we focused on the dangers of antinomianism, the importance of the third use of the law, and how these topics have impacted the Missouri Synod's preaching and teaching in recent years. This year, we will be focusing on the beautiful harmony of God's Law and Gospel and how His promises shape the Christian life. As recently sainted John Warwick Montgomery said, "The answer to antinomianism, social-gospel legalism, and existential relativism lies not only in the proper distinction between Law and Gospel, as C. F. W. Walther so effectively stressed, but also in the proper harmony of Law and Gospel, as set forth in the classic doctrine of the Third Use of the Law."

Over two days at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Collinsville, IL, February 28th and March 1st, we will learn about and discuss God's Law and Gospel, preaching, growth and struggle in the Christian life, and what the Lutheran Confessions have to say about all these matters.

Our School's New Seal

The central element to the school's seal is a large cross with the rose, heart, and cross that hearken to Luther's seal. The laurel wreath encircling the seal has its origins in classical antiquity, and was synonymous with victory or high achievement. The most prominent element—the cross—makes clear that our ultimate victory is in Christ, not in our achievements.

Martin Luther's rose was designed to represent the evangelical church. The cross-inscribed heart represents faith in Jesus Christ, whose death on the cross gives us life. The white rose means that faith in Christ brings lasting peace and joy to the believer. The blue field means that our faith and joy, although real, are not yet complete; the believer hopes for his fulfillment in grave. The gold band that encircles the shield represents the eternal joy and riches of heaven.

The seal design also contains a Bible verse near the bottom, because all godly education is rooted in the word of God. Thus Psalm 119:111 is fittingly included as a motto, which extols God's testimonies as our inheritance and joy.

Doorstep News ~ February 2025

The year 2024 felt a bit like a repeat of 2023 in many ways! The needs of our neighbors remained at an increased level. We provided 2,964 food orders in 2024, exceeding the increased number we provided in 2023. Doorstep assisted with nearly 168,000 pounds of food to feed our neighbors and spent almost \$84,500 on food purchases to keep our pantry shelves stocked to feed our neighbors in need! Our food budget in two years went from \$6,900 to \$84,500; that is an increase of over 1,100%! Doorstep applied for more grants to assist with food purchases and our supporting faith communities and individuals stepped up to donate more food, and gave money so we could buy food in bulk. At this point, we do not foresee a drastic decrease in the need for food in 2025, and our budget reflects the amount we anticipate needing to spend to feed our neighbors in need.

One way to help in the first part of 2025 is by donating towards our annual SouperBowl Sunday's collection of soup and crackers! During the weekend of the Super Bowl (February 7th – 9th) we ask our faith communities and mission partners to collect soup, all varieties, and crackers to help stock our food shelves. A successful event will keep our pantry shelves stocked with soup for a few months, at least!

In 2024, we set a goal of 5,000 pounds, and we received over 8,400 pounds!!!! With the increased need last year, we are going to set an increased goal for this year's event...

2025's Goal for SouperBowl Sunday weekend is... 5 tons = 10,000 pounds of soup and crackers!

This is a caring community made up of neighbors helping neighbors, and I know we can meet this year's goal!!!"
