



At the risk of sounding like a broken record, **the need for food assistance is still high** this year with totals nearly equal to last year's amounts through July. With all of the changes happening in our country right now with programs and funding being cut that many of our neighbors need to survive, the need for our services is going to be greater and more important to help families and individuals stay afloat. For our neighbors who are already struggling to make ends meet, keeping their rent and utilities paid, having kids out of school and home this summer, and dealing with the crisis that life can throw at us... keeping food on the table has and will continue to be a challenge. We have already spent \$38,500 purchasing food to meet the need, and keep our neighbors fed. In the first seven months of 2025, we spent \$150,252 on rent, utilities, dental & prescription vouchers, Topeka Metro passes, gas vouchers, hygiene products, auto services, and more.

The Hymn of the 2025-2026 School Year: LSB 589 "Speak, O Lord, Your Servant Listens" Verse of the Year:

John 5:24 "Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever hears My word and believes Him who sent Me has eternal life. He does not come into judgment but has passed from death to life."

Each year the staff picks the hymn and verse of the year. This has been a great way to focus on certain themes from God's Word that we can meditate on through word and song.

LSB 589 is found in the "Word of God" section of the hymnal and flows very nicely into the next section of the hymnal, which is "Baptism." The words "newborn life and spirit give me" teaches us that the Word of God works through this means of grace to give us eternal life. Our life as baptized children is one of confidence that even when we encounter "death's dread power," and the "inward strife" between our Old Adam and God's Word, God's words give us life and light and are our "sword prevailing."

The theme that we especially want to draw from this hymn and teach the children is the act of hearing God's Word and keeping it. This means that both Law and Gospel are important for us in our daily life. It is a blessing to listen to God each day in chapel, in the classroom, and in the home.

The Mission of the Church

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you."
