Sing, Pray, and Keep His Ways

A few takeaways from the 26 October discussion about children in worship

- It's important for the parents to be intentional about teaching their children at home and at church how to live as a Christian, specifically in the Divine Service (posture, singing, participating, serving, etc.)
 - o Home devotions are a part of a parent's calling to raise their child in the faith
 - The same motions that happen in the Divine Service can happen at home (begin by making the sign of the cross, read God's Word, pray, sing, etc.)
- It's important for the church/congregation members to encourage and support each other in these efforts through "mentors" and provide opportunities for children and adults to interact with each other in the midst of learning about the faith.
- Music in the church for children should be full of substance and purpose, and something they can grow into and not grow out of.
- Goals for St. John's:
 - Strengthen the idea of a "mentorship" within the congregation and more opportunities to connect children with other members of the congregation.
 - Be intentional about teaching children the purpose of what they do and sing in church.
 - o Provide resources for parents in discussions about the Divine Service.
 - Establish ways in which children can help serve before, during, or after the Divine Service, even at a young age (i.e. music, altar guild, usher service, acolyte, etc.).

A Teacher's Book Review by Bethany Johnson: "Wisdom and Eloquence" by Robert Littlejohn and Charles T. Evans

(Since the beginning of August, the teachers have been reading and discussing this book during their staff meetings.)

This book begins by defining the purpose of education in light of the Christian educational life, or "discipleship." True wisdom comes from God's Word that is the foundation for everything else that we learn. Eloquence, then, encourages students to think, discern, and behave wisely, putting "proper words in proper places." As the book puts it, "we aim to shape individuals who are both heavenly minded and capable of doing great earthly good." Perfection in this area is ultimately centered in the person of Christ, from which truth, goodness, and beauty flow.

Through a community of faith and learning, a liberal arts approach to education provides a "worldview, a mind-set, and an ethos" that is connected more with inherited tradition and knowledge from the past. The majority of education should be reading: students reading aloud, students reading silently, and teachers reading aloud from great works. This sharpens their listening skills, awakens their imagination and creativity, and instills a deeper love for stories.

Throughout the areas and subjects of the trivium and quadrivium, we as teachers assist the parents in developing the students' habits of mind and heart, leading them into "the conversation of the ages," and connecting what is ordinary to the sublime of God's existence in our lives, as evident in His Word, which is God's wisdom given to us in Christ.
