

School Field Trips

Learning takes place both inside and outside of the classroom. This past month, the students at St. John's Classical Lutheran School recently had several opportunities to connect their learning in the classroom to the outside world.

Students have been reading Farmer Boy and Little House in the Big Woods by Laura Ingalls Wilder. They visited a modern-day farm and were able to see real cattle and calves, as described in the books. They also saw how crops are planted and harvested in modern times. They compared and contrasted this with how crops were raised in the historical books we've been reading.

The students also visited the Kansas City Symphony to hear a program based on the character of fairy tales. Each piece of classical music featured different aspects of literature, such as setting, character, and conflict. Similar to literature, music tells a story, and through this art, we learn the beauty of its sound, how the sounds interact together, and how those interactions reveal a masterpiece of art for us to experience and enjoy.
